Highlights from Feb Board Meeting

1. Alberta Education places an emphasis on stakeholder engagement to establish locally developed priorities, by school divisions, and shares the progress toward achieving those priorities and its' results. Palliser's Education Plan requires input from parents, students, staff and other key stakeholders and is creating survey tools for information. Please watch for these opportunities to share your thoughts and ideas.

2. The Ministry of Education will conduct its annual satisfaction telephone/online surveys to collect public and participant perceptions of Alberta's education system. The surveys gather responses from the general public, parents, high school students, teachers, principals, school board trustees, as well as employers of recent high school graduates. The total number of completed surveys will be over 6,000. The survey responses are completely confidential and will provide valuable information to identify areas of strength and areas needing improvement.

3. The Palliser Technology Services Department is focused on providing students and staff with the tools needed to ensure high-quality learning environments. All schools now have a 1:2 device student ratio, 2 additional technical staff hired, Bandwidth doubled in 19 schools, the wireless network has been updated and Smart Boards being replaced by Epson Interactive Boards for cost savings. There has been an increase in

the number of Google classrooms from 2,850 to just under 4,200. The amount of live online instruction now averages close to 1,000 daily users.

4. Kristin Krein is Palliser's Indigenous Success Coordinator. She is a resource for students, families, staff and community and will provide site-based professional development for First Nations, Metis and Inuit student cultural activities. At present, she is counselling over 150 students building their relationships with other students and encouraging awareness of Indigenous culture.
